Shangri La Museum of Islamic Art, Culture & Design

known as Diamond Head. Originally the home of American heiress Doris Duke, the site has been reimagined to become a museum focused on the arts and cultures of the Islamic world and the artworks that have been commissioned and installed throughout the museum and landscapes.
